

UAE Report



Tony Partridge, Sales Manager for the Middle East and African countries recently visited with Al Jaber Steel Products in Abu Dhabi.

The Al Jaber group was founded in Abu Dhabi with the main focus being that of the construction sector.

This was to complement the economic boom that was beginning to emerge in the U.A.E region.

The AI Jaber group is now one of the largest in the Middle-East with many divisions including contracting, construction, shipping, trading, heavy-lift and logistics.

One such division is Al Jaber Steel Products, where first and foremost, they manufacture trailers. Having transport and construction companies within their group, Al Jaber knew exactly what was required by the end user. Driven by their own sister company's needs, they saw a requirement for a low bed, 100 ton payload capacity trailer, preferably with a folding gooseneck to give quick and easy on/off loading of equipment.

The idea was quickly turned into reality and the first trailer was designed and built for their own construction company. Mr. Sarkis, G.M. of the trailer division determined that four Heavy duty, YORK 20 tonne capacity, wide track axles would be perfect for this application.

So successful was the trailer design that they were soon winning orders from all parts of the Middle East and Africa.

To date, they have built some 250 trailers to this design, all on YORK axles and not one complaint. The photograph above shows one such trailer carrying two fully equipped tanks, supplied to the army. Total Payload \sim 105 tonnes.

Launching York's **FIRST** Trailer Axles York India, Jamshedpur

York Transport Equipment (India) (YTEI), a subsidiary of TRF, (a TATA Enterprise) launched its first axle from its manufacturing facility located in TRF's premises in Jamshedpur, India this month.

In view of the increasing demand for trailers and the need to be close to the rapidly growing customer base in India, the York Group, a subsidiary of TRF, since October 2007, has set up YTEI. York's products have been sold to trailer builders in India for the last five years. Tata Motors is a major user of York axles and other ancillary products. They sell these along with their prime movers as packages to fleets and end users.

Speaking on the occasion of the launch, Mr. Sudhir Deoras, Managing Director of TRF, and chairman of the York Group, said that YTEI would increase their capacity in the long term to produce over 100,000 axles per annum.

York's most popular axle in the Indian market is the 5021 series. It is 6" square axle with a 14mm wall thickness, specifically designed for trailer applications and can carry 12 tonnes at a speed of 105km per hour. This capacity is needed and appreciated by the operators who require some flexibility to meet the load and road conditions across the country.

York products meet European ECE quality standards, TUV and have compliance approvals with the (ADR) Australian Design Rules.

YTEI plans to start manufacturing other variants of this and other axles required for the domestic market to meet the growing enquiry for air suspensions. As the road infrastructure improves and the presence of global transportation companies increases, they bring with them added demand for new technologies.

Staff were very excited with the progress to date and look forward to a very promising future.
